A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE EFFORTS OF THE CELTIC CLUB OF OHIO AS THEY WORK TO MAKE A POSITIVE DIFFERENCE IN THE LIVES OF MANY, THROUGH LOCAL COMMUNITY SERVICE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, 2017 will mark the Eighth Annual Celtic Club Fights Cancer/Bras Across the Crooked River events; and

WHEREAS, the Celtic Club Fights Cancer/Bras Across the Crooked River events began as a way to raise awareness of breast cancer and has evolved to raise awareness of all cancers; and

WHEREAS, since the first display in Kent in 2010, the Celtic Club has organized displays in more than 30 locations in seven counties in northeast Ohio, and has donated more than 10,000 bras to battered women shelters; and

WHEREAS, the displays are meant to convey a message of hope and survival; and

WHEREAS, the July 6, 2016 display spanned the entire length of the 905-foot High Level Bridge overlooking the Cuyahoga River Valley, in memory of Cuyahoga Falls resident John Hutchens who passed away from lung cancer in 2015, and his sister Cathy Pate who passed away from breast cancer in 2013. John's wife Beverly Hutchens, led a memorial service after the display was hung; and

WHEREAS, the Celtic Club's eighth annual event will include a display across the High Level Bridge in 2017 coinciding with National Breast Cancer Awareness month; and

WHEREAS, the volunteers of the Celtic Club Fights Cancer/Bras Across the Crooked River are an example of the power of people coming together for the common good of others.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

- <u>Section 1</u>. The Council hereby recognizes, thanks and supports the efforts of the Celtic Club of Ohio as they work to make a positive difference in the lives of many, through local community service.
- Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances.
