8 945.06, AND 945.14 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES,
9 RELATING TO THE CITY CEMETERY, AND DECLARING AN
10 EMERGENCY.

11
12 BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Cuyahoga Falls, County of Summit,
13 and State of Ohio, that:

14
15 Section 1. Sections 945.02, 945.04, 945.06, and 945.14 of the Codified Ordinances
16 of the City of Cuyahoga Falls are hereby amended to read in full as follows (new text
17 underlined; deleted text in ~~striketrough~~):

18
19 **945.02 Definitions**

20 As used in this chapter, the following terms are defined as follows:

- 21 (a) "Cemetery" refers to all cemeteries owned by the City of Cuyahoga Falls.
- 22 (b) "Columbarium" means a vault with niches for urns containing the ashes of
23 cremated human remains.
- 24 (c) "Cemetery section" means a subdivision of a cemetery as depicted on a cemetery
25 map.
- 26 (d) "Cremation garden" means a designated area in Oakwood Cemetery for the sole
27 purpose of interment of cremations.
- 28 (e) "Crypt" ~~or "vault"~~ means a space in a mausoleum of sufficient size used, or intended
29 to be used, to entomb uncremated human remains.
- 30 (f) "Designated cremation plots" means those plots designated, due to their size, for
31 cremation burial only.
- 32 (g) "Director of Public Service" means the Director of Public Service of the City of
33 Cuyahoga Falls or his/her designee.
- 34 (h) "Entombment" means the placement of human remains in a crypt or vault.
- 35 (i) "Grave" means an interchangeable term describing a plot or niche in which the
36 remains of a deceased person are interred.
- 37 (j) "Infant plot" means those plots designated, due to their size, for infant burial only.
- 38 (k) "Inurnment," means the placement of human cremated remains in an urn which
39 is placed into a niche.
- 40 (l) "Lot," means a subdivision of a cemetery section as depicted on a cemetery map.
- 41 (m) "Marker" means a bronze or granite tablet set flush with the established
42 ground/earth grade.
- 43 (n) "Mausoleum" means any above ground burial structure.
- 44 (o) "Memorial" means a marker, upright monument, or crypt or niche name plate.
- 45 (p) "Niche" means a space in a columbarium used, or intended to be used, for
46 inurnment of cremated human remains.
- 47 (q) "Nonresident" means a person who is not a resident of the City.
- 48 (r) "Owners" refers to plot or grave owners who are defined as persons who have been
49 deeded specific plots, or who have established a right to succeed in ownership in
50 accordance with City ordinances.
- 51 (s) "Perpetual Care Endowment" means monies received for the purpose of perpetual
52 care of the plots. Such charges shall be paid in full at the time of purchase and shall not
53 be deferred under any circumstances. Perpetual Care only covers general maintenance of
54 cemetery plots, it does not cover special care of headstones, plantings, or miscellaneous
55 items.

56 (t) "Plot" means a space within a lot of a cemetery used or intended to be used for earth
57 burial; one grave.

58 (u) "Resident" means a person who meets at least one of the following criteria:

59 (1) Currently resides in the City of Cuyahoga Falls;

60 (2) Resided in the City of Cuyahoga Falls immediately prior to entering a care
61 facility; or

62 (3) In the case where the grave or niche to be purchased is for a deceased person,
63 one plot or niche may be available to that person at a resident rate provided:

64 A. He/she was a resident at the time of his/her death; or

65 B. He/she was a resident immediately prior to enrolling in a college or university,
66 or entering active service in the United States armed services.

67 (v) "Vault" or "eCrypt" means a space in a mausoleum of sufficient size used, or
68 intended to be used, to entomb uncremated human remains. means a lined and sealed
69 outer container for a casket. Vaults must be constructed of steel or concrete.

70 (w) "Veteran" means those individuals recognized for Veteran's status by the Federal
71 Government.

74 **945.04 Deferred Payments; Sale and Cancellation Upon Default.**

75 ~~If not paid for in full at the time of purchase, plots or niches may be sold upon the~~
76 ~~following terms: one third (1/3) cash on the day of sale, the remaining two thirds (2/3)~~
77 ~~within one (1) year from the date of the sale. Such deferred payments shall be secured by~~
78 ~~the promissory note of the purchaser, and such notes shall not bear interest until due.~~
79 ~~No deed shall be delivered until the entire purchase price has been paid. No marker,~~
80 ~~memorial or niche plate shall be placed, nor shall a burial be permitted on such plot or~~
81 ~~in such niche, until the full purchase price has been paid, and in the case of a burial, a~~
82 ~~burial permit has been received by the Director of Public Service. Upon default in the~~
83 ~~payment of the purchase price of any plot or niche purchased after June 1, 1968, the~~
84 ~~City shall have the right, upon first giving thirty (30) days written notice by registered~~
85 ~~mail addressed to the purchaser of record or, if the name and/or address of such~~
86 ~~purchaser cannot be ascertained, by publication for one (1) time in a newspaper~~
87 ~~published in the City or the County, to declare the sale of such plot or niche canceled.~~
88 ~~Thereupon all rights of such purchaser to such plot or niche shall be terminated and any~~
89 ~~payments thereon shall stand forfeited to the City as liquidated damages for failure to~~
90 ~~purchase such plot or niche.~~

91 **945.04 Rules and Regulations**

92 Except as specifically stated herein, the Director of Public Service may establish
93 rules and regulations for the operation of City cemeteries. A copy of the rules and
94 regulations shall be maintained in the office of the Director of Public Service.
